Cross-Continental Sleuthing for Hometown History

Now Meeting at Round Table Pizza on Fremont Boulevard



You want to write a believable story based on real facts, but facts aren't easy to come by. On Saturday, Sept. 23rd, David Kiehn will show you how it's done.

David has spent most of his life working in film-related jobs. But it wasn't until he made a remarkable discovery and was featured on "60 Minutes" that he gained national attention. For years, Kiehn knew about a 12-minute silent film shot in San Francisco from a cable car and dated to 1905, but Kiehn suspected otherwise. Through meticulous detective work, he proved that "Market Street" was in fact shot four days before the great

earthquake of April 18, 1906.

Suddenly, the film took on a haunting poignancy: We now look at the San Francisco newsboys, carriage jockeys and women in elaborate hats, and know that earth-shattering disaster awaits. But "A Trip Down Market Street" wasn't Kiehn's only research coup. He's identified several lost films and assembled the long-forgotten history of a silent film star in his 2003 book, *Broncho Billy and the Essanay Film Company*.

How does he do it? He'll give a look into the methods he employs at our next meeting at Round Table Pizza's meeting room. Round Table is in Fremont's Centerville district, across the street from the Center Theater on Fremont Boulevard, between Peralta Boulevard and Central Avenue.
