

DIALOGUE: Body Language Communicates More Than Words

In real life, body language communicates more than words. Only 7% of meaning is communicated with words leaving 93% of meaning presented nonverbally. This is important information for mystery writers. If dialog is a critical vehicle for moving plot forward, the body language is a critical element of good dialog.

When writing dialog intersperse it with body language that consists of facial expression, posture, gestures and actions.

In writing body language consider your characters' emotions – anger, sorrow, love, hatred, fear, worry, guilt-and feeligs-exasperation, disbelief, defiance disagreement, confidence, boredom. Here are a few examples of ways to express meaning through body language.

Anger – Her jaws clenched then she knocked his gift of roses to the floor.

Boredom – While he explained, she checked her watch, looked around the room then started drumming her fingers on the desk.

Sorrow – She didn't answer. She just stared in silence while tears began streaming down her cheeks.

Insincerity – She dismissed his question with a fake smile.

Love – Her eyes brightened and she answered his proposal with a big kiss.

Exasperation – He frowned, rolled his eyes and shook his head then stomped out of the room.
